Providing a framework of recommendations to guide decision-makers in fostering a more vibrant and competitive business environment for the City of St. John's.


This document focuses on recommendations and solutions and is designed to build on the foundation set by our What We Heard report. That earlier report captured the voices, experiences, and priorities of our members — business and community leaders from downtown and beyond — and reflected the realities they face every day. This report takes the next step by translating those insights into concrete actions and forward-looking strategies. Together, these recommendations form a roadmap for strengthening our business community, fostering growth, and ensuring that our city and our downtown remain vibrant and competitive.

Earlier this year the Board of Trade hosted a Downtown Business Engagement Session to gather input from the business community on how to revitalize our city and our downtown and create a more attractive, welcoming, and prosperous environment for residents and businesses alike. Since then, we have been encouraged to see acknowledgment of several of the core issues and recommendations raised during that session. Encouragingly, the City of St. John's has released a Downtown Forward Secondary Plan that reflects many of the same themes and priorities we heard directly from businesses.

Our recommendations are based on our own analysis and engagement, while remaining mindful of the City's plan. To monitor its progress and guide precise, thoughtful policy action, we put forward the following recommendations.







- Coordinate training for businesses on de-escalation and referral supports.
